


I hope everyone had a nice summer, and have been able to enjoy the great start to the fall season.

Center Health Care is proud to announce the opening of a new blood draw site at 314 So Manning. Many years of discussion and collaboration with Albany Medical Center have resulted in the creation of a fully disability accessible blood draw space which will provide a much needed and often neglected medical service. and developmental disabilities have logistical challenges to having routine and urgent bloodwork done that are critical in monitoring complex medical issues. Our space has three open bays which while ensuring privacy have adequate space to accommodate those with special needs as well as routine patients. Our parking lot allows simple access through the outside of the building for all comers. #### Caregiver Toothbrush:

Our caregiver toothbrush was born out of a need for a more efficient brushing process. We have completed the Research & Development phase and are now undergoing clinical trials with Tufts University. The clinical trials have progressed through the first two phases, with one phase remaining. In the second phase, the results showed that the caregiver toothbrush significantly outperforms a standard toothbrush at brushing another individuals' teeth. This is a major victory!

I'm proud to work alongside our Operations Manager, Dr. Larry Ruff, PhD, and three talented volunteers from RPI. The contributions from our alumni are invaluable, and we thank them for their contributions to our mission of improving lives through innovation.
