Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

About the Psychiatry Services at Center for Disability Services (CFDS)

1. What is changing?

CFDS plans to stop offering psychiatry services at Center Health Care on **December 31**, **2025**.

2. Why is this happening?

We have tried very hard to keep psychiatry services open. But it has become too difficult because:

- It is very hard to find psychiatrists trained to care for people with developmental disabilities.
- Costs keep going up, but payments from Medicaid have stayed the same for many years.

3. Are other health services at CFDS closing too?

No. Only psychiatry services are planned to stop. All other services will stay open, including:

- Primary Care
- Dental Care
- Audiology (hearing)
- Physical Therapy
- Occupational Therapy
- Speech-Language Pathology
- Vocational Rehabilitation

4. What will happen to people who get psychiatry care now?

It depends on where each person lives:

- **People in CFDS residential programs:** You will be offered **telepsychiatry care** with StationMD. You will have your own assigned provider.
- **People in state or other providers' residences:** Staff from your residence will tell you about next steps. We are giving them options and guidance.

• **People living on their own in the community:** We encourage you to work with your Coordinated Care Organization (CCO) and local providers who can help you or your loved one find care.

5. What is telepsychiatry?

Telepsychiatry means seeing your provider on a screen, like a video call. It:

- Cuts down on travel and wait times.
- Lets you and loved ones meet from a familiar place, often with family or caregivers nearby.
- Helps people see the **same provider each time**, which builds trust and better care.
- Is proven to work just as well as in-person visits for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

6. How will families and patients get updates?

We are sharing information through:

- Mail
- E-mail
- The patient portal
- Conversations with our staff

We also will hold an **informational open house** at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 1, 2025, in Room 608 at 314 S. Manning Blvd., Albany, NY 12208, so you can meet with care coordinators, ask questions, and learn about next steps.

8. Why can't CFDS just keep psychiatry services?

- Several psychiatrists have retired, and we cannot find new ones trained in developmental disabilities.
- Medicaid payments have stayed flat since 2007.
- Costs keep rising every year.

These problems are happening across the country, not just at CFDS.

9. What is the main message families should remember?

- CFDS plans to stop psychiatry services on December 31, 2025.
- All other services remain the same.
