


Student Bill of Rights

At Langan, Prospect, and Cloverpatch you have the right to learn, grow, and be treated with respect. Here's what that means for you:




1. Right to a Learning Plan That Fits You

- You have the right to a free education that meets your needs and helps you make progress. Your teachers and team will work with you to create a plan just for you (your IEP).



2. Right to Be Included in Decisions

- You have the right to be part of decisions about your education, including your goals and the services you receive.



3. Right to Be Treated Fairly

- You should never be treated differently because of your disability, race, religion, gender, or anything else about you.



4. Right to a Safe School

- You have the right to learn in a safe and supportive environment, free from bullying, harassment, or abuse.



5. Right to Privacy

- Your personal information, school records, and health information are private. You and your family control who sees it.



6. Right to Support

- You have the right to get the help you need to succeed—this can include therapy, counseling, or special tools and technology.



7. Right to Speak Up

- If you or your family disagree with a decision about your education, you have the right to ask questions and ask for a review.



8. Right to Be Respected

- You have the right to be treated with kindness and respect. Your abilities, identity, and culture matter.



9. Right to Clear Information

- You have the right to know what's happening with your education. Your teachers and school will explain things clearly and keep you and your family informed.
